#### A CHIPPENDALE PERIOD SIDE CHAIR

### England, circa 1765

Moss Harris & Sons in their *The English Chair* (1937) illustrate an identical armchair. The accompany text refers to: 'a set of five (side chairs), and one elbow, mahogany chairs'. It is quite conceivable that the side chairs were sold either as a set of four or two pairs, leaving one single chair available, likely our chair. Moss Harris ascribed these chairs to Chippendale.

A fine and rare George III mahogany "Chippendale Director period" side chair, showing superb quality carving throughout. The carved splat back is very closely related to Plate IX of Thomas Chippendale's *Gentleman and Cabinet-Maker's Director*. With silk upholstered drop in seat, the front cabriole legs with finely acanthus carved detail and ending in bold scroll toes. Good colour and patina throughout.
